We are having a wonderful harvest this year. Corn was the most plentiful item we gleaned. Items harvested include: lettuce, tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, sweet corn, cantaloupe, peaches, eggplant, onions, watermelons, apples, squash. We have blanched sweet corn for our Molly Pitcher Holiday dinner, made salsa, the Kids in the Kitchen cooking class went corn crazy and many volunteers worked hard to fill the S.H.A.R.E. pantry. Many thanks to volunteer Connie Lowe who has been keeping the kitchen in such great order.

We thank our local growers for their generosity including: Gary and Ron Kiner, The Dietchs, The Shirks, The Leids, Spiral Path Farm, Fetters, First Church of the Brethren's children's garden, The Dickinson Student Garden, Weavers, Burkholders, The Kniselys, The Downtown Pomfret St. Farmers Market and Peters Orchard.

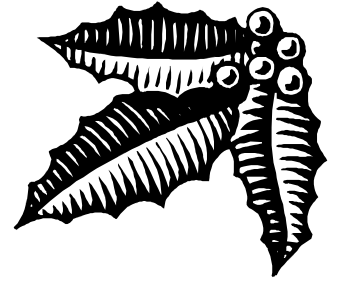
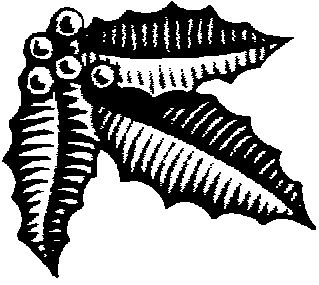

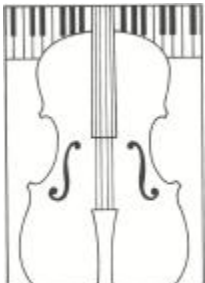
