

S.H.A.R.E.

Mission:

In response to God's call to love one another, Project S.H.A.R.E. provides food, clothing, nutritional education, and links to other community resources to empower people in need within the Greater Carlisle Area.

History:

Project S.H.A.R.E. is an interfaith, non-profit cooperative that helps the hungry by providing, free of charge, supplementary food on a monthly basis to residents of the Greater Carlisle Area since January 1985.

With the help of over 50 local congregations, businesses and civic groups, and major funding from United Way and the Carlisle Area Health and Wellness Foundation, we distribute food boxes containing 45 to 55 nutritious food items to over a thousand families each month. Intake, qualification, and distributions take place at our 10,000 square foot facility donated by and located on the Dickinson College campus.

In addition, free produce, much of it gleaned at local farms, and bread are made available at the Project S.H.A.R.E. Farm Stand in downtown Carlisle.

We also make available clothing, nutrition information, emergency assistance, and help through inter-agency referrals.

Seven full-time and three part-time staff, and 2,000 community and recipient volunteers support the program.

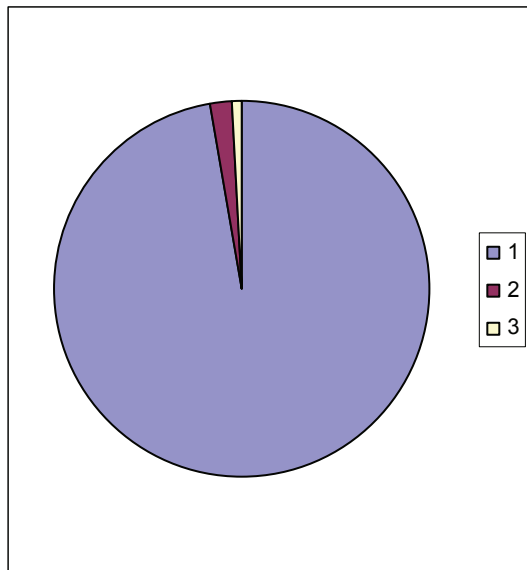
